Dear Parents,

We have had a week of thought and reflection, starting with our Remembrance service on Friday. We were proud to be able to join members of the village community around the war memorial for a time of thanks, prayer and remembering. We began our silence with the playing of the Last Post and the respectful lowering of the British Legion flag and ended with the Reveille and raising of the flag. The children then laid their pilgrimage stones around the war memorial and Sammy and Ella (our Head Pupils) laid a sign and a posy of Poppies. Afterwards we invited families and members of the community back to school of refreshments. It was lovely to see those of you who joined us. Rowan class have well and truly started getting into the Christmas spirit this week by beginning to practice songs for their Christmas performance. They have already learned so many lyrics and actions and Miss Everett, Miss Watkins and I are incredibly proud and cannot wait to see them perform in a few weeks' time! In geography this week we looked at the seven continents and discovered that the UK is in Europe! As our topic is focused on India, we found it on the map and discovered that it is in Asia. In DT, we carried out some research on the computer to find pictures of Diya lamps as we will soon be designing and making our very own out of clay!

Whitebeam

As Whitebeam class are on their trip today, we are saving their certificates until next week.

In Whitebeam this week we have been looking at what needs to be included when writing a biography and we have put facts about Howard Carter into chronological order and have started to identify time openers (fronted adverbials). The children have explored handling clay in art and using different techniques and they have made a small sculpture. We need to work on how to securely join pieces of clay together though! In maths we continue to look at addition and subtraction and have been working on the expanded column method and using base 10 to help us. We have also looked at bar models and finding totals using coins. In history we have made different timelines, for example, one from the dinosaurs to the present day and we have then looked at where a timeline of Ancient Egypt would match and compare the dates. In PSHE we have thought about bullying as this links with national anti-bullying week. At the time of writing this we are very much looking forward to our trip to the Fitzwilliam Museum in Cambridge. Hopefully we can tell you all about next week!

Reader of the Week – Esther for her recent enthusiasm with her new book and for being able to articulate so brilliantly why she is finding it so enjoyable.

Writer of the Week - Isla for researching our topic thoroughly to enable her to write with accuracy and with vivid descriptions.

Shining Light of the Week – Didier for showing kindness towards many members of our class this week and for helping others as well as always demonstrating good manners and a helpful attitude with members of staff. **Pen licences** - for Izzy, Ellie-Mai, Esther, Seth and Riley.

This week in Oak class we have continued exploring early civilisations within our History work. The children have enthusiastically delved into some quality information texts and have been inspired by the range of techniques used to convey facts. We have learnt that texts can sometimes present the information in quite quirky ways and yet still be historically accurate and informative. We have then used this as inspiration for our own writing.

In maths we have continued our work on multiplication, learning about the short multiplication method and expanded method to help us solve a range of questions. We have drawn on our existing knowledge of place value and rounding to help us quickly check if our answers are correct. Some of our more able mathematicians have been provided with some stretch and challenge questions to help them deepen their understanding. We have learnt some fantastic new vocabulary this week through our current reading text (Beetle Boy) and children have enjoyed sharing definitions with the class.

We will soon be coming to the end of our swimming lessons (our last lesson is on 1st December) and it has been such a joy to see some of our children who were previously quite anxious in the water now demonstrating such confidence and resilience in our weekly lessons.

It was anti-bullying week this week and we explored not only how we can recognise and respond to bullying but also how we can build strong friendships with others.
