Dear Parents,

Christmas Cards

We are happy if the children would like to send their friends a Christmas card this year – the post box is already out. We know that some would rather choose to send just to close friends, just one card to the whole class or choose not to send any cards at all, particularly to be eco-conscious. As a school family, we completely understand and respect your own decisions on Christmas cards.

PE Kits

Please can I remind you that your child needs to have their PE kits in school from Monday to Friday and it needs to include a separate sweatshirt or jumper from their school one. We try and go outside as much as possible, especially the older children, and if they fall over wearing their school one it can become wet or dirty. If your child's kit becomes particularly wet or dirty then we will send it home!

End of Term Individual Attendance

We are working hard to ensure that all children are in school all the time so that they can learn and achieve well. Every week we tell you the class and whole school percentages. However, we know that it is tricky to know whether your child is on track for strong attendance so at the end of next week we will be sending home your child's individual attendance for this term. If your child's attendance is below 95%, we may ask you to come in and meet with us to discuss how we can support you to improve their attendance depending on the circumstances around their low attendance. If you are not invited for a meeting but would like to meet then you are of course welcome to do that. Ultimately we want the children in school all the time (recognising that there will be the odd day here and there where they are genuinely poorly) and we are here to support you in doing that.

Attendance this week/since beginning of term

We have been hit with quite a lot of illness over the last couple of weeks. We know that it is tough when you are feeling a bit under the weather and there will be times when your child is genuinely not well enough to come to school but if they have a bit of a sniffle or a little cough then they can be in school. We will look after them and we will always call you if we feel that they are not well. Let's see if we can hit that 96% target of strong attendance by the end of term!

We are working hard this year to ensure that we reach the best attendance we can. **96%** is considered strong attendance and is so important for ensuring that your children learn and achieve well. **95% - considered satisfactory** attendance by the Government and Ofsted as well as us - means not missing any more than ten school days over the whole year.

News from our Classes

The Christmas festivities have been non-stop in Rowan class this week! The children have had a lovely week which has been filled with exciting activities, including going to see The Elves and the Shoemaker, which the children loved! On Thursday, we had our final run through of our play before we performed to the school on Friday and we also made our Christmas hats which we wore whilst we ate our delicious Christmas dinner. The children put so much effort into their Christmas hats, they looked fantastic! Rowan class are very excited to get their costumes on and perform their Christmas play in front of adults from home next week, it will be such a lovely way to finish off the year.

Whitebeam

What a fantastic week we have had in Whitebeam Class with lots of exciting things happening. On Wednesday we went to see The Elves and the Shoemaker at West Acre Theatre. It was an amazing experience for the children and they joined in enthusiastically and it was wonderful to see their faces and reactions throughout the performance. We have been busy preparing for our Christmas performance and during a rehearsal on Thursday we had a surprise visitor as Santa popped in to see us and we all loved seeing each other's Christmas jumpers and had a yummy Christmas lunch. We have started to make our clay bricks for our step pyramids and have even more respect now for how the Ancient Egyptians made their pyramids! In maths we continue to work on geometry including repeating patterns along with arithmetic and Tackling Tables and we have been thinking about prediction and retrieval skills in our reading.

Oak

This week, Oak class have been finishing off their playground designs for Design Technology. We have begun to complete some writing based on 'The Christmas Truce' of World War 1, focusing on sequencing the events in order and acting it out through role-play. In maths, we have learned how to find common denominators in fractions so that we can work out the answers to calculations. In our R.E. learning, we researched Mahatama Ghandi and considered how his religious beliefs encouraged him to act in the way that he did. In science we have been learning about food chains and ecosystems as well as some of the threats to those ecosystems. We have been working hard on preparing content for the church service next Friday and all children have enjoyed writing poems and prayers with either a Christmas or a winter's theme. We thoroughly enjoyed watching a dress rehearsal of the Rowan/Whitebeam Nativity play and it was clear that both classes have been working really hard on preparing such a brilliant production. One of our highlights from this week has, of course, been our trip to Westacre Theatre to watch Alice in Winterland. All children behaved beautifully and we had a wonderful afternoon together. We have all been extremely proud of all of the children in Oak class this week as

they have worked hard on learning behaviours and being the best role models that they can be - well done on your hard work!

Swaffham Community Fridge;


Based in Swaffham Community Centre, this is a drop-in service where you can access food. Here is an extract from their blog;

If you don't already know, the idea of the community fridge is to prevent perfectly edible food from going to landfill. Supermarkets that would otherwise have to dispose of food past its sell by date donate it to us instead and we safely redistribute it to the community.

There still seem to be several misconceptions surrounding the concept, such as the belief that it is a form of food bank and only available to those on a low income or in special need of help. The fridge is open to absolutely anyone in the community. As long as it means food isn't being wasted, we welcome everyone. We also do not require monetary donations, but if you have any spare store cupboard items, we will happily accept suitable food donations to redistribute via the fridge or we will give them to other local agencies that may be in need. We hope this helps clear things up a little and welcome you to pop by and see what's on offer. The community fridge is open at 10am Monday to Friday. Please see Facebook for further details.

Attendance

Thank you for supporting your child's attendance at school every day. We are pleased that most of our children across the Federation are 'green' (see below) and get to access learning opportunities and make strong progress. We have adopted the local authority attendance policy (see attached) and want to remind everyone that the target is 97% - not because we get any praise or issues if the target is achieved or not, but because we know that children who are in school 96% of the time or more have the best advantages in education and we want that for ALL our children.
