Rowan

Mathematician of the Week – Leon for spotting patterns to help with his addition calculations.

We have had another super busy week in Rowan Class, the children have shown a fantastic learning attitude and have worked so incredibly hard. We were super excited to see some snow for the first time this year and went straight out to explore! Lots of investigations and predictions were discussed. This week we have been continuing to look at Oliver's vegetables in English, Reception have drawn their diaries as if they were Oliver and year 1s have written their own using all of the diary features we have learnt, some fantastic ideas!. In maths, reception have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes in the environment and creating their own pictures using 3D faces. Year 1s have learnt about measurement, ordering objects from shortest to longest and shortest to tallest. They have used unifix cubes to measure objects in the classroom and

were introduced to measuring with a ruler. In science we have been classifying animals into their groups and discussing the similarities and differences of each group. Well done Rowan class for another brilliant week.

Children's worship - Florence, Molly, Leo and Ella

In Whitebeam Class the children have loved looking at aerial views of Castle Acre and surrounding villages as part of our learning in geography. They have recognised and located many features of Castle Acre and thought about the difference in land height between Castle Acre and the coast. In science we looked at the life cycle of a human and compared it to different animals and in music/ICT they have looked at notes and tempo as they created musical patterns on the Chromebooks. They explored using different instruments and discovered they could write their names and it would play as a tune! Today they have written a descriptive story based on a lighthouse keeper thinking about how to include suspense and tension and in maths we have come to the end of our focus on fractions. Next week we will be looking at statistics. It has been very exciting to see the snow this week and we were all surprised by the size of some of the snowflakes we have seen! Well done Whitebeam.

In maths we have continued with our work on decimals and percentages and also have started learning about perimeter. In science we have learnt about levers, gear and pulleys and our children were very enthusiastic when designing their own Rube Goldberg machines. We have a slightly longer weekend due to the power cuts but we look forward to seeing our children back with us again on Monday. Our year 6 children have been incredibly resilient in their attitude towards their mock SATs this week, which will continue into next week. Well done to all of you!
