



Message from the Executive Headteacher....



I wanted to ensure that everyone is aware of the situation with regard to term time holidays but also unauthorised absence (although we see very, very little of this at NVF - well done families).

Under the new national framework, all schools will be required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

If you feel that you have no option but to need leave of absence then please do book an appointment and come and talk to me before booking anything, and then we can agree a way forward. This will save us having to issue Fixed Penalty Notices that we do not want to issue. Once issued, they are very difficult to withdraw and essentially cannot be.
